Arts: _____ One course from Fine Arts, Music, or Drama (not Communications)

Humanities: _____ One course from Fine Arts, Music, Drama, English, Journalism Communications, Philosophy, or Foreign Language at the 2000 level or above

Social Sciences: _____, _____, _____, _____ Four courses from Anthropology, Economics, Geography, History, Political Science, Sociology, Urban Studies, Education (only EDCL, EDFR, EDSP).

Two of these courses must be at the **2000 level or above**.

Math: 1115, 1116; **or** 1125, 1126; **or** 2111

Computer Science: 1000 or 1060 or 1201 or 1583 (Choosing 1060, 1201, 1583, 1203 or 1205 decreases Science Electives by 3 hours and increases Other Electives by 3 hours.)

Science Sequence: Biology 1071, 1073, 1081, 1083
or Chemistry 1017, 1018, 1023
or Physics 1031, 1032, 1033, 1034
or Physics 1061, 1062, 1063, 1065

Science Electives: 8 hours – at any level, see exceptions below.

Choose from courses in Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Earth and Environmental Science, Math, Physics.

The Science Sequence and Science Electives must include at least 3 hours from Biology and 3 hours from Chemistry, Earth and Environmental Science, or Physics.

Check the catalogue for prerequisites for ALL science classes. Most require that you are eligible for MATH 1125, which means that you have completed at least MATH 1115 or have a math ACT score of 22 or higher.

The following courses **MAY NOT** be used as Science Electives:

Chem 1012, 1020. Math 2314 and any 1000 level course (except Math 1140).

Bios 1051, 1053, 1061, 1063. CSCI 1000.

Phys 1001, 1002, 1003, 1004, 1010, 1020, 1030.

Plus you must take PSYC 4000 (the zero credit exit exam),

- Three additional courses must be taken, chosen from at least two different groups.
- At least three of the six courses discussed above must be at the 4000 level.
